Algeria's Lagab storms to stage win in Dukhan

2014 Tour of Zubarah: The 28-year-old grabs the yellow jersey

DOHA: Algerian rider Azzedine Lagab yesterday grabbed stage one of the Tour of Zubarah with a slick finish in Dukhan.

The 28-year-old topped the 120.1km stage - that began in Madinat Al Shamal - ahead of Kristijan Fajt and grabbed the yellow jersey.

In third place yesterday was Algeria's Abderrahmane Mansouri.

Lagab clocked a time of 2 hours 45 minutes and 19 seconds. Fajt finished with the same while Mansouri was 37 seconds slower than the day's winner.

Fajt said: "I hope I can continue with my rhythm tomorrow also. All the time I was close to winning the stage but it slipped in the last few meters."

Wednesday's blue jersey winner David Per of Slovenia was fifth, a notch above Austria's Martin Weiss. Dutchman Wouter Sybrandt was placed seventh while Austria's Mario Schoibl secured the eighth spot. Yellow jersey winner on Thursday Roman Van Uden of New Zealand ended the day in ninth spot while Croatia's Radoslav Rogina of team Adria Mobil rounded off the top-10 riders yesterday.

Lagab now heads the overall classification with a time of 2:50:29, some 19 seconds better than Fajt.

Van Uden is in third spot, some 30 seconds adrift of Lagab. Defending champion UAE's Yusif Mirza yesterday finished 14th to drop down the pecking order. Qatari riders haven't done well in the two days, grabbing the points table following indifferent performances. Abdullah Afifi is in 32nd spot after two days in the individual classification after stage one. Diego Hossfeldt is in 39th spot whereas his team-mate Moosa Said is in 47th place.

Qatar coach Branko Phillip said: "There are very strong riders here. I am missing Ahmed Al Boudainy. He broke his leg in training. We are missing our best rider."

Phillip added: "I hope the ones present here make a better result than today. But we'll see. Ahmed is out for four weeks. But without him, it seems it would be difficult. We will do our best. We are trying. We have only five riders here. But this is it. We have to compete. We have to fight."

Per still holds the blue jersey after two days of competition.

Gay's former coach banned for 8 years

COLORADO SPRINGS: Jon Drummond, former coach of US sprinter Tyson Gay, has been banned for eight years after arbitrators ruled he possessed, trafficked and administered banned drugs to an athlete he coached.

The US Anti-Doping Agency announced the ban is to begin on December 17.

The ban prohibits the 46-year-old former sprinter from coaching, training or advising athletes and participating or coaching at any event sanctioned by USA Track and Field or the sport's global governing body the International Association of Athletics Federations (IAAF).

"Coaches have an inherent responsibility to protect athletes - not to take advantage of them - but to ensure that they receive the support, training and advice they need to win fairly and in accordance with the rules," USADA chief executive Travis Tygart said in a statement.

Drummond was Gay's coach when the athlete was suspended in June 2013 after testing positive for a banned anabolic steroid in two out-of-competition

tests. As part of his punishment, Gay also returned the silver medal he received for the 4x100m relay at the London Olympics.

But the panel of independent arbitrators found from two years to one by USADA due to Gay's cooperation, which included information that contributed to the agency's case against Drummond.

US sprinter Marshvet Hooker and Trinidad and Tobago's Kelly-Ann Baptiste, both of whom worked with Drummond, also provided information.

Drummond, who won an Olympic 4x100m relay gold at the 2000 Sydney Games and was part of the elite John Smith stable that included former 100m world record holder Maurice Greene and Trinidadian ace sprinter Ato Boldon, had denied involvement in Gay's positive drug test.

But the panel of independent arbitrators found that Drummond was instrumental in connecting Gay with a chiropractor named Clayton Gibson who provided Gay with the DHEA that resulted in Gay's positive test.

The panel ruled that Drummond "failed to act

in the manner expected of a coach of athletes in the Olympic movement." Based on testimony from parties involved, the arbitrators were satisfied that Drummond, who leaped of Gibson from Hooker, recommended that Gay consult Gibson as a last resort in his efforts to train and compete without pain.

The arbitrators found that Drummond failed to intervene sufficiently when Gibson showed him and Gay cremes labeled "Testosterone/DHEA," "HGH" and "Progesterone Creme" which were later sent to the athlete in Oregon.

Drummond, who earned the nickname 'Crown Prince of the Track' during his athletics career, argued he advised Gay not to use the cremes, but the coach nevertheless removed the labels and took them to Europe at the athlete's request, and Gay used some of the products in July of 2012.

Although both coach and athlete had concerns about the cremes, Drummond testified that he didn't believe they contained banned substances.

"I didn't know," he said. "And so I didn't process it to even, like, think about it."
